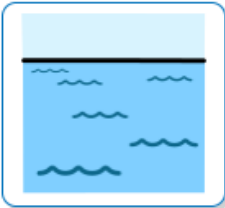


# Ash Class Year 1/2– Mad About Minibeasts- Summer Term 1 2026

Living things can be found within habitats. Habitats are suited to the plants and animals found within them. Global habitats include deserts, rainforests, savannahs, oceans and woodlands. We will explore some animals and plants found in these habitats and think about why they thrive there.

## Glossary

**Living**– living things are plants including seeds and animals.

**Dead**– These are things that have once been alive, including animals and parts of plants no longer attached.

**Never been alive**– These are things like rock, metal and plastic.

**Past**– something that has already happened.

**Present**– this is what is happening now.

**Habitat**– A natural home or environment of a living thing.

**Micro-habitat**– A small area within a habitat such as bark or leaves.

**Mini-beast**– A small invertebrate animal such as an insect or spider.

**Insect**– An animal that has six legs.



## Making Nature Pouches

Eric Carle was the author of books such as ‘The Very Busy Spider’ and ‘The Bad-Tempered Ladybird’.

He created coloured, textured papers and cut them into collages to make his pictures. Cutting and tearing the paper gives different effects to make soft petals and crisp leaves.

We will be developing our running stitches using our original designs to create class bunting with nature motifs!

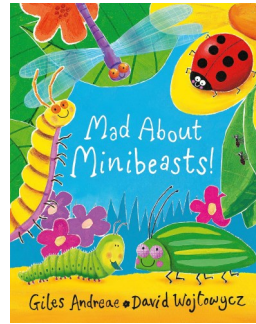

## English



Poetry is a fun way to learn more about minibeasts! Each poem in *'Mad About Minibeasts'* tells us facts and uses rhyme. Our riddles about minibeasts will also use rhyme and similes too!

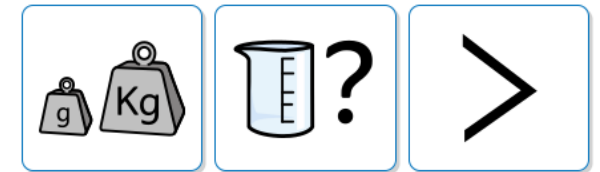


## Maths

2-digit numbers up to 100 can be partitioned into tens and ones. Understanding the value of each digit allows us to sequence, order and compare numbers. We can identify one more and one less.

Mass measures how heavy or light an object is. We can use the words heavy, heavier, heaviest and light, lighter, lightest to describe the mass of objects.

Volume measures the amount of liquid in a container whilst capacity tells us the maximum amount a container can hold. We can use the words full, empty, half full and half empty to describe volume. We can compare capacity of different shaped containers.



## PSHE

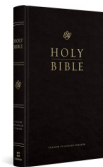
Our jigsaw journey in PSHE takes us to Relationships. We will look at family dynamics and begin to understand that all families are different. We will know what we expect in a friend and identify people that are special to us.



## RE

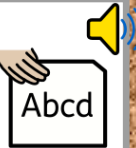
What are sacred texts and why do they matter?

Some books may be described as special, sacred or holy. Many people believe that God has inspired people to tell or write about beliefs and value to help understand how to live their lives. We will explore the special and sacred texts from three religions to identify their origin and why they are considered sacred.



## Phonics

Alternative graphemes are special friends that make the same sound but are spelt differently. The sound 'or' shut the door makes the same sound as 'aw' yawn at dawn. We will begin to choose the correct alternative grapheme when spelling words with sounds we know.



## Computing

Digital books are made using an electronic device such as a computer or tablet. They can be read on the device and can include animation and sound.

In Purple Mash, the program 2Create a Story has the feature to allow characters to interact with one another along with added text.
